



THE WILDLANDS CONSERVANCY PIONEERTOWN MOUNTAINS PRESERVE

Dear Parents:

On **May 17th**, your child will attend a field trip to Pioneertown Mountains Preserve.

Your child should be prepared for all weather conditions. It can be cold and windy in the morning or on overcast days. It can also become quite hot between late spring and early fall. Have your child dress in layers that can be removed if the weather warms up. Closed-toe sneakers or walking shoes are required. Make sure that your child has a large, filled water bottle that can be carried on the walk.

Activity levels will be high, so please make sure your child has a big breakfast. Our preserves protect wildlife by asking all our visitors to pack out their trash; avoid excess lunch packaging.

PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD WEARS OR BRINGS THE FOLLOWING:

- A **full** water bottle or canteen
- Tennis shoes or walking shoes (**No sandals**)
- Long pants unless weather is hot
- A sweater or jacket (gloves, scarf, etc. for cold weather)
- Lunch (**Pack lightly, as we ask all visitors to pack out their own trash!**)
- Hat or visor
- Sunscreen
- Any necessary prescribed medications



DO NOT BRING:

- Money
- Gum
- Candy
- Radios, electronic games, (**cell phones should be left on the bus**)

LOCATION:

The preserve is located about 4 miles north of Pioneertown. Take Pioneertown Road to the intersection of Pipes Canyon Road and turn left onto the dirt road. Proceed about 1 mile to parking lots near the Ranger Station.
